The Greenlining Institute completed an analysis of the number of Freshman African American males entering the University of California in fall 2004. To ensure objectivity Greenlining did not grade on a curve, but on the following standards: A: 4%; B: 3%, C: 2%; D: 1%; F: Below 1%; FF: Below 1/2 of 1%.

African American males make up approximately 3.5 % of California's population in the college age group.
