This Policy Package:

- ✓ **Denies the Administration “blank check” authority** over decisions about how to invest AB 32 revenues.
- ✓ **Ensures the legislature has an active role** in allocating revenues from AB 32.
- ✓ **Timely and necessary now.** The state's first carbon auction is scheduled for November.
- ✓ **Does not authorize any new fee.** Establishes a framework, should there be any revenues from AB 32 implementation.
- ✓ **Does not spend any money now, nor prescribe any specific investments.**
- ✓ **Helps meet the requirements of AB 32 to “direct investments to disadvantaged communities”¹** by establishing a process and framework.
