The theme of the graduation ceremony was "Giving Back and Lifting Up." The theme emphasized reciprocity on the part of community leaders who remember and appreciate the impact their communities had on their development. Graduates at the ceremony consisted of Greenlining Institute Summer Associates and the institute's 2009–2010 Fellows. The Fellows are post-graduates who work with targeted grants from Greenlining in the areas of teaching, financial education and community economic development, and consumer protection and workers' rights.
